


NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

NEIGHBORHOOD BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

For most of us, our home is our largest investment and as such it is important that we maintain our property values. Please take some time to evaluate your property and make sure it is in compliance with the governing documents and neighborhood standards.

Duty of maintenance includes but is not limited to:


- Prompt removal of all litter, trash, refuse and waste. Please don't use your driveway or front porch as storage. Also store your trash containers in your garage out of the public view.
- Lawn mowing and edging of all curbs and edgeways on a regular basis. Weekly mowing is preferred during the growing season.
- Tree and shrub pruning. Be sure to trim branches and remove sucker growth on your trees. Shrubs should be trimmed on an as needed basis.
- Watering landscaped areas as necessary to maintain turf and vegetation in a healthy living condition. Be sure to follow Frisco water restrictions as well.
- Keeping lawn and garden areas alive and free of weeds and attractive. Shrub beds should not have grass and weeds growing inside of them. Adding mulch will help "dress up" your shrub beds and conserve moisture in the summer and add warmth in the winter.
- Repair of exterior improvements and repainting of improvements. Check your siding, doors, shutters and trim on your house to see if they need a fresh coat a paint. Maintaining your home now will save you from costly repairs later
- Remove and replace dead or missing trees. October is a great time to plant new trees.
- Repair/replace broken fence boards, posts and lattice work. Fences should be a uniform stain color. If you make any repairs to your fence, please stain the new wood boards and or lattice work.



ARCHITECTURAL REMINDER



Before you buy a bucket of paint, install a shed, build a patio cover or go on a shopping spree at Home Depot, be sure to submit an Architectural Request and receive written approval prior to beginning any <u>exterior</u> modifications.

Failure to receive written approval may result in costly expenses to modify the improvement or to restore the property back to its original condition.

Written approval is not required for planting seasonal flowers such as petunias or replacing dead landscaping.

- To keep homes safe for visiting trick-or-treaters, parents should remove from the porch and front yard anything a child could trip over such as garden hoses, toys, bikes and lawn decorations.
- Parents should check outdoor lights and replace burned-out bulbs.
- Wet leaves should be swept from sidewalks and steps.
- Restrain pets so they do not inadvertently jump on or bite a trick-or-treater.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

- Don't become complacent because you drive a older-model vehicle. Older cars can be resold quickly or stripped for parts. A vehicle's parts are worth two to three times the value of the car.
- Put all packages and personal items out of sight. Items left in the open make your vehicle a more desirable target.
- Close all windows, lock all doors and take the keys with you. Almost 25% of stolen vehicles had the keys in them.
- Never hide a second set of keys anywhere on your vehicle. Thieves know all the hiding places.
- Never leave the vehicle running, even if you will only be gone for a second. The most common place for stolen vehicles is at convenience stores, gas stations and ATM's.
- Park in well-lighted areas. Over 50% of vehicle thefts occur at night.
- Use your garage; lock both the vehicle and the garage. Locking both doors greatly reduces the chance of theft.
- Keep your garage door opener with you. The thief may use it gain entry to your residence.
- Never leave your registration or title in the vehicle. File these documents in a safe place. If the thief has these documents the vehicle will be easier to sell.
- Park in attended lots, thieves don't like witnesses.
- Have your VIN number etched onto your windows. This makes it difficult to switch VIN numbers on a stolen vehicle.
